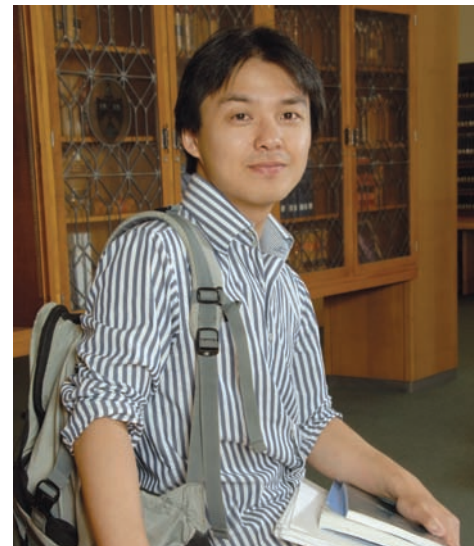

### Nondiscrimination Statement
