

**AFFIDAVIT OF DEACON DANA WILLIAMS**

I, Dana Williams, do hereby state and affirm as follows:

1. I am the Chairman of the Association of Community Organizations for Reform Now ("ACORN") in Georgia, a position I have held since January of 2004.
2. Among its other projects, ACORN works with Project Vote on voter registration initiatives. I am personally involved in ACORN's voter registration initiatives, including its formal voter registration drives. Specifically, I actively participated in ACORN's formal voter registration drives in Georgia in 2004, and although no formal drives were held, I actively registered voters as a member of ACORN in 2005.
3. No formal voter registration drives have been organized by ACORN in 2006, because of Georgia's regulations, which I understand require that voter registration applications be sealed before they are delivered to a voter registration worker, and prohibit copying of such applications. These regulations prevent ACORN from verifying information submitted to the State Election Board and from implementing ACORN and Project Vote's standard procedures for quality-control, monitoring, and record-keeping purposes.
4. As the Chairman of ACORN in Georgia, my responsibilities include overseeing ACORN's formal voter registration drives and ensuring that deputy registrars and ACORN staff are verifying information, submitting accurate voter registration applications, and following ACORN and Project Vote's procedures.
5. If it were not for Georgia's regulations, I would help organize and participate in formal voter registration drives on behalf of ACORN in Georgia in 2006.

I solemnly affirm under the penalties of perjury and upon personal knowledge that the contents of the foregoing paper are true.
