**DECLARATION OF
ELIZABETH S. WESTFALL
IN SUPPORT OF
PLAINTIFFS' MOTION
FOR AN AWARD OF
ATTORNEYS' FEES
AND COSTS**

I, Elizabeth S. Westfall, declare as follows:

1. I submit this declaration in support of Plaintiffs' Motion for an Award of Attorneys' Fees and Costs and base it on personal knowledge.
2. I am a Senior Attorney with Advancement Project, a national civil rights organization based in Washington, DC, and the Deputy Director of its Voter Protection Program.
3. I am admitted to practice law in the District of Columbia and New York. I earned a B.A. with honors from Carleton College in 1990 and a J.D. with honors from Harvard Law School in 1996, where I was Editor-in-Chief of the *Harvard Women's Law Journal*. Upon graduating from law school, I became an associate with the litigation department of Wilmer,

Cutler & Pickering, a law firm in Washington, D.C. At Wilmer, Cutler, I worked on a variety of commercial and international litigation matters before federal courts.

4. In 1998, I became a staff attorney with the Fair Housing Project of the Washington Lawyers' Committee for Civil Rights & Urban Affairs in Washington, D.C. While at the Lawyers' Committee, I worked on a range of civil rights matters on behalf of plaintiffs, including *Gilliam v. HBE Corp. d/b/a Adam's Mark Hotel*, C.A. No. 99-596-CIV-ORL-22C (M.D. Fla. 1999) (public accommodations racial discrimination lawsuit); *Neithamer v. Brenneman Property Svc., Inc.*, 81 F. Supp. 2d 1 (D.D.C. 1999) (housing discrimination); and *Doka v. Greencastle Lakes Community Ass'n*, CA AW-99-220 (D. Md. 1999) (same).

5. In 1999, I joined Relman & Associates, a plaintiff-side civil rights law firm, as an associate. While at Relman & Associates, I litigated a variety of civil rights cases, including *Trammell v. Ouisman Wheaton Plaza Chevrolet, Inc.*, DKC 02 CV 1491 (D. Md. 2002) (gender discrimination in employment); *Buchanan v. Consolidated Stores, Inc.*, C.A. No. DKC-99-CV-3736 (D. Md. 1999) (racial discrimination in public accommodation); and *Clermont v. Host Marriott Svc. Corp.*, MJG99CV1665 (D. Md. 1999) (racial discrimination in public accommodations). In 2002, I served as co-lead counsel on behalf of plaintiffs in the trial of a case styled *Woodard v. Cactus Grill* (D. Md. 2000) (racial discrimination in public accommodation) in which a jury awarded plaintiffs both compensatory and punitive damages. Following the trial, plaintiffs filed a fee petition which the court awarded in full.

6. Since 2004, I have been employed by Advancement Project, where I am currently the Deputy Director of the Voter Protection Program. Advancement Project's Voter Protection Program focuses on removing barriers to voter registration and voting among low-income communities and communities of color. As Deputy Director, I am responsible for the

day-to-day supervision of six attorneys who advocate on behalf of voters in select counties in Florida, Pennsylvania, Michigan, Missouri, Ohio, and Virginia.

7. While employed by Advancement Project, I have litigated, along with co-counsel, several federal voting rights cases, including *AFL-CIO v. Browning* (S.D. Fla. 2004) (formerly captioned *Diaz v. Browning*) (challenging a Florida statute prohibiting the processing of corrections to timely submitted voter registration applications after the registration deadline, in time for the applicant to become registered for the upcoming election); *ACORN v. Cox* (N.D. Ga. 2006) (challenging a Georgia regulation requiring the sealing of voter registration applications and prohibiting the copying of voter registration applications); *Fla. NAACP v. Browning*, No. 4:07-civ-402 (N.D. Fla. 2007) (challenging a Florida statute requiring that a voter applicant's driver's license or social security digits match with a record in the corresponding database prior to registration); and *Ass'n of Communities for Reform Now, et. al. v. Blanco*, No. 06-661, Section B-1 (challenging election laws governing a New Orleans municipal election and requesting out-of-state satellite polling places in cities with large concentrations of New Orleans voters displaced by Hurricane Katrina).

8. I have also conducted public records litigation in state court to seek copies of incomplete voter registration applications, and have negotiated settlement agreements in voting-related matters in Maryland and Missouri. I have also testified before Congress on voter registration issues.

9. I attach hereto as Exhibit A is a true and correct statement of hours and services that I rendered in this case. I prepared the statement to the best of my personal knowledge, based upon a review of my contemporaneous time records. It is my practice to keep contemporaneous records of the time I spend on litigation matters. Once a case is completed, I

review my contemporaneous time records, check them against the time records of co-counsel, and make adjustments as appropriate in the exercise of ordinary billing judgment.

10. I believe that the hours that I am claiming are reasonable. As my time records indicate, I played a significant role in this litigation, which resulted in an extraordinarily favorable result for plaintiffs. Among other things, I interviewed potential plaintiffs; researched and drafted sections of plaintiffs' opposition to defendants' motion to dismiss the complaint, particularly regarding standing; interviewed witnesses to assist with cross examinations of witnesses for the State at the hearing on the motion for preliminary injunction; drafted sections of the proposed findings of fact; and attempted to negotiate with the Secretary of State the promulgation of regulations that would reduce the burden to third-party registration groups. In my work on this case, I did not duplicate the work of co-counsel.

11. I also provided plaintiffs with expertise on and experience with the novel and complex legal and factual issues in this case, based in part on my thorough understanding of the voter registration system in the State of Florida and in many Florida counties, comparable systems in other states, and the legal protections available to eligible registrants under the United States Constitution and other federal law.

12. The hourly rate of \$400.00 that I respectfully request is consistent with the rate for attorneys of comparable qualifications and experience in the Miami area, and is the appropriate lodestar rate given my special expertise in the area of constitutional litigation regarding voting rights and voter registration.

13. I respectfully request compensation in the amount of \$64,440.00 for my work in this case based on the 161 hours I spent litigating this case as described in Exhibit A, multiplied by my requested hourly rate.

14. In addition, I seek \$720.54 in expenses related to my travel to Miami to assist with preparations for the preliminary injunction hearing, including by helping prepare plaintiffs' cross-examinations of defendants' proposed witnesses. Records of my expenses are attached hereto as Exhibit B.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.



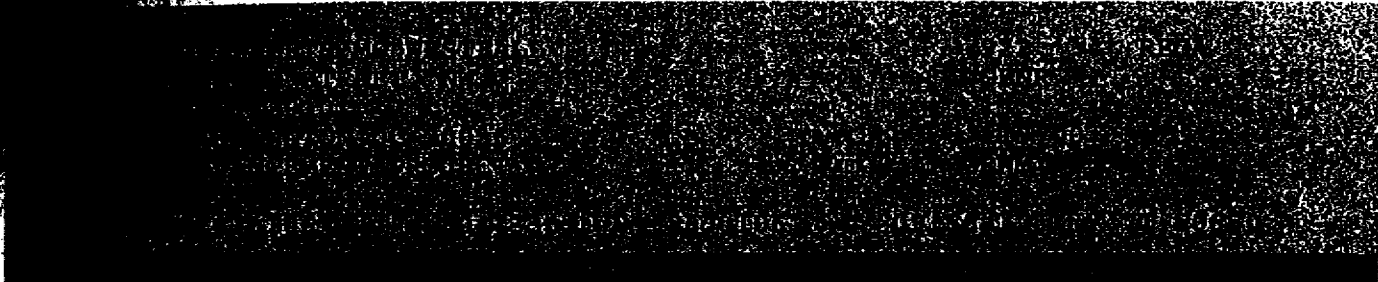
