## DECLARATION OF KRISTINA BOARDMAN IN SUPPORT OF DEFENDANTS' SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT REGARDING DISTRIBUTION OF PROVISIONAL BALLOT INFORMATION TO IDPP PETITIONERS

- I, Kristina Boardman, pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1746, hereby declare as follows:
- 1. I am the Administrator of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV).
- 2. Starting on November 4, 2016, DMV distributed a provisional ballot information sheet to all IDPP petitioners. A copy of the information sheet was attached to my October 28, 2016 declaration as Exhibit 2, and is attached hereto has **Exhibit 1.**
- 3. I have learned that distributing the provisional ballot information sheet since the election has been causing confusion for

applicants, because there is no current election, so DMV is ceasing

distribution of those sheets.

4. I believe that that ceasing distribution of provisional ballot

information sheets will prevent unnecessary confusion.

5. For future elections, DMV will distribute a provisional ballot

information sheet to all IDPP applicants. Specifically, DMV will distribute a

provisional ballot handout that is substantially similar to Exhibit 1, modified

with updated dates, between February 17 and 24, 2017 for the February 21,

2017 election; between March 31 and April 7, 2017 for the April 4, 2017

election, and likewise for future elections, or until otherwise ordered by this

Court or an appellate court.
