STIPULATIONS

The United States and Defendants Ike Brown and the Noxubee County Democratic Executive Committee hereby enter into the following stipulations:

1. Noxubee County election records reflect that Harry James Hardin, and not Henry James Hardin, was on the list of persons who voted an absentee person in the Shuqualak precinct for August 7, 2007.
2. Noxubee County election records reflect that Harry James Hardin's absentee ballot was rejected because he voted in person at the Shuqualak precinct in the August 7, 2007 Democratic Primary election.

3. Noxubee County election records reflect that at the Shuqualak precinct on August 7, 2007, 640 persons voted either in person or by absentee ballot.
4. Noxubee County election records reflect that at the Macon Fire Station voting precinct, 575 persons voted either in person or by absentee ballot.
5. The parties stipulate to the admissibility of (a) the Voter Profile Reports of voters Everlena Glenn and Everleana Glenn; and (b) the declarations of Muriel Robinson, Octavia Stowers, Billie Dickson, Laura Samantha Dickson, Barbara Perry, Henry Lee Stewart, Catherine Johnson, Mildred Reed, Lafeyounda Brooks, and Sonya Slaughter, all of which were attached to the Defendants' Reply to Plaintiff's Motion for Permanent Injunction, which was filed August 21, 2007.
6. The parties stipulate to the admissibility of the voter receipts books for the Shuqualak precinct and Central (Macon Fire Station) precinct, attached hereto.
7. The parties stipulate that the remedial Order in this case will not affect the holding of the August 28, 2007 primary runoff election for the state offices of State Auditor and Public Service Commissioner (Central District).
8. The parties stipulate that in light of the agreements set forth herein, the continuation of the remedial hearing is unnecessary.




