

SUPPLEMENTAL DECLARATION OF SARAH BURKE

My name is Sarah Burke and I am over the age of 18 and fully competent to make this declaration. Under penalty of perjury, I declare the following:

1. After I submitted my application for an absentee ballot online, I kept checking the status of my ballot on the My Voter Page. Unfortunately, I could not view any information about my ballot because the relevant portion of the page was greyed out.
2. On June 1, 2020, eight days before my ballot was due, I received an email from the county saying that the application had been processed. The sender of the email also apologized for the backup.
3. Based on the email, I got the impression that the absentee ballot was still coming in the mail.
4. However, I never received my ballot in the mail.
5. My husband did not receive an absentee ballot even though he had had also applied for one.
6. My family has continued to take very strict social distancing measures.
7. My husband and I discussed whether it was safe to vote in-person during the pandemic. Although we were nervous about the risks of in-person voting, we felt that it was important to vote, especially after George Floyd's death.

8. Before voting in-person, the last time I was in a building with people outside my household for an extended period of time was late March of 2020.
9. On June 9, 2020, I walked to my polling location and voted in-person.
10. Although I did not have to wait long to vote, being in a building with other people after a long period of social distancing was scary. I did everything I could to vote as quickly as possible so I could minimize my time in the building.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
