


DECLARATION OF MATTHEW WISE

My name is Matthew Wise and I am over the age of 18 and fully competent to make this declaration. Under penalty of perjury, I declare the following:

1. I am a registered Georgia voter and resident in Fulton county.
2. I am a United States citizen and am 41 years old. I have not been declared mentally incompetent by a judge, and I am not currently serving a sentence for a felony conviction.
3. I am an infectious disease epidemiologist at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC").
4. Although I am not vulnerable to complications from COVID-19, my mother and mother-in-law take care of my children, and so we have taken social distancing measures to make sure they are not exposed to the virus. My wife and I have been teleworking during the pandemic.
5. I planned to vote in-person on Election Day.
6. I arrived at my polling location at around 6:30 a.m. on Election Day, before the polls had opened. By that time, there were already forty or fifty people ahead of me.
7. The line outside snaked pretty far outside the building by the time I got in line.

8. Once we got inside the building where the voting machines were, the poll workers did a pretty good job of making sure small numbers of people were coming in.
9. But it was pretty confusing where we were supposed to go once we got inside the building. I spent some time wandering aimlessly in the building until I finally figured out where I was supposed to go.
10. When I finally was able to vote, I noticed that the ballot count on the scanner at the polling station indicated only 43 votes had been cast after the polling site had been open for approximately one hour and 45 minutes.
11. Going to vote was the most I've been exposed to the outside world in a while, especially because I spent such a long time waiting in line.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
