

**DECLARATION OF LAUREN WADDOUPS**

My name is Lauren Waddoups and I am over the age of 18 and fully competent to make this declaration. Under penalty of perjury, I declare the following:


1. I am a registered Georgia voter and resident in Fulton county.
2. I am a United States citizen and am 26 years old. I have not been declared mentally incompetent by a judge, and I am not currently serving a sentence for a felony conviction.
3. I submitted an application for an absentee ballot in April, and monitored the status of my ballot using the My Voter Page. One day when I checked the My Voter Page, it showed that my absentee ballot was mailed out on May 22, 2020.
4. However, I never ended up receiving my absentee ballot in the mail.
5. I have been practicing social distancing measures to ensure the safety of myself and my family during the coronavirus pandemic. I have been trying to minimize the time I have spent outside my apartment.
6. I have a one-year old child, so leaving the apartment isn't easy for me even without the pandemic. But since I didn't receive my absentee ballot, I had to leave my apartment and vote in-person.
7. I went to my polling location at around 9:00 a.m., and waited in line for about an hour.

8. Originally, a poll worker sent me to the wrong line, so I had to go to another line after already having waited for a bit.
9. For the most part, I felt safe in line. But when I went inside the polling station, I was pretty nervous having people on both sides of me. It was the first time in a while I had been so close to people outside my household.
10. While I was waiting in line, I was given an affidavit to sign about my absentee ballot and how I was not going to be using an absentee ballot to vote. After I voted, poll workers told me I could just take it with me. This didn't seem right to me, so I made a stink about it and asked to speak to a supervisor. After talking to a supervisor, the poll workers realized they had been dealing with the affidavits the wrong way, and that they were supposed to be collecting them from voters after they had been signed.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
