

**DECLARATION OF KARYN HUDSON**

My name is Karyn Hudson and I am over the age of 18 and fully competent to make this declaration. Under penalty of perjury, I declare the following:

1. I am a registered Georgia voter and resident in Fulton county.
2. I am a United States citizen and am 65 years old. I have not been declared mentally incompetent by a judge, and I am not currently serving a sentence for a felony conviction.
3. I submitted an application for an absentee ballot in at the end of March of 2020. Although I have never voted through absentee ballot before, I decided to apply for an absentee ballot in this election because my age puts me at greater risk for complications from coronavirus.
4. I got a confirmation that my application had been received on April 14, 2020. A few weeks later, I checked the My Voter Page (“MVP”) and saw that my application had been approved, mailed, and received by the elections office. But later on when I checked the same page, all information about the status of my ballot had disappeared, which was very confusing.
5. On May 26, 2020, I virtually attended a Neighborhood Planning Unit Zoom meeting in my community and asked Fulton County Commissioner Natalie Hall about the issues I was having with my ballot. She told me to email her

about it so that she could follow up with Fulton County. I emailed her the next day to follow up about my question.

6. On May 28, 2020, I received an email from Fulton county confirming that my application was received and my ballot was in the mail. That same day, I responded to the email from Fulton County and informed them about how information about the status of my ballot had just disappeared from MVP.
7. On May 29, 2020, I received a reply from Richard Barron, the Director of the Fulton County Board of Registration and Elections. He said that he had heard rumors about this type of issue but had never been emailed by a voter about this issue. He also noted that “[t]he State controls MVP.”
8. I replied to him the same day, reiterating that I was concerned about the status of my absentee ballot. I told him that I now had zero faith in the absentee ballot system, and that the only reason I was getting one this time was because my age put me at a greater risk.
9. Richard Barron replied to my email the same day stating that I should not lose faith, and that because of COVID-19, there were many changes that were going to be made by the office.
10. I expressed my sympathies and said I understood that his office had faced many challenges.


11. On June 3, 2020, I reached out to Richard Barron again, stating that I had still not received my absentee ballot.
12. Richard Barron then sent an email to an individual named Pam asking her if she could track my ballot. I was copied on this email, along with several other Fulton county officials.
13. I never received a response from Pam or anyone else from Fulton County about the status of my ballot.
14. When I still had not received my absentee ballot by mail as of June 4, 2020, I decided that I was not going to wait any longer in the hope that it might actually be delivered. Around 7:20 a.m. I went to the Garden Hills Elementary School early voting location to cast my vote in person. I decided that I'd take that risk of in person voting because it had become clear to me that I'd been failed by the Fulton County Elections office.
15. I finally received my absentee ballot in the mail on June 5, 2020 at 5:30pm, which is the time our mail was delivered.
16. On Election Day, June 9, 2020 there was quite a bit of confusion in our neighborhood as well as adjacent neighborhoods as to where to go to vote. The regular polling locations were closed. Apparently Fulton County had decided to put several voting precincts into one location, but neglected to inform the voters that everyone would be voting at the Scott's Crossing

library at 2489 Perry Blvd. We received a notice letter about this change on June 10, 2020 dated May 22, 2020.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
