

**DECLARATION OF MERCY WRIGHT**

4. I decided to vote absentee in this election because of the COVID-19 pandemic. If I contract the virus, I could die.
5. I have been practicing strict social distancing measures to minimize my risk of getting the virus.
6. I applied for a mail-in absentee ballot in May.
7. The week before the election, I still had not received my ballot. I started to get worried that I would not receive my ballot in time to vote in the primary election.
8. I finally received my ballot the weekend before the primary election.


9. When I received my ballot, I noticed that the envelope in which I was supposed to stick my ballot had been moistened and glued shut. Luckily, I managed to open it and put my ballot inside.


