

**DECLARATION OF FANTASIA SMITH**

My name is Fantasia Smith and I am over the age of 18 and fully competent to make this declaration. Under penalty of perjury, I declare the following:

1. I am a registered Georgia voter and resident in Fulton county.
2. I am a United States citizen and am 34 years old. I have not been declared mentally incompetent by a judge, and I am not currently serving a sentence for a felony conviction.
3. I didn't apply for an absentee ballot. I don't have stamps at home, so it would have been very inconvenient for me to get them. Plus, it doesn't make sense to me that you would have to pay to vote by having to buy stamps.
4. I moved to a new apartment in November of 2019. As soon as I moved, I made sure I changed my address for my driver's license and voter registration.
5. In February of 2020, I got a letter and a voter registration card confirming my change of address. The letter said that my new polling location would be Parkside Elementary.
6. I am a project manager and have been working from home since March of 2020. Recently, my office has opened up for a few days a week. I am now expected go into work on Mondays and Tuesdays and work from home the rest of the week.

7. On June 9, 2020, I went to Parkside Elementary to vote in-person. I got there around 6:45 a.m., and there were approximately 50 people ahead of me at that time.
8. It took me approximately three hours to get to the desks close to the front of the line where poll workers were confirming our voter registration. When I got to a desk, a poll worker told me that my polling location was somewhere in East Point. They had an address on file where I had last lived approximately a decade ago. I couldn't understand why they had an address that was so out-of-date.
9. I asked if there was any way I could vote. But the poll workers said there was nothing they could do. They did not offer me a provisional ballot to vote.
10. I was very upset I could not vote at Parkside Elementary. I had taken an extra hour and a half off work to vote on a day where I was supposed to physically be present at the office.
11. By the time I found out I could not vote at Parkside Elementary, I did not have time to go stand in a long line in East Point to vote. Because of this mishap, I wasn't able to vote at all in the primary elections.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
