


**DECLARATION UNDER PENALTY OF PERJURY
PURSUANT TO 28 U.S.C. § 1746**

1. My name is Genia Billingsley. I am over eighteen years of age and competent to testify to the matters contained herein.
2. I am a resident of Fulton County in Georgia and my residence address is 626 South Eugenia Place NW, Atlanta GA 30318.
3. I received my application for an absentee ballot in the mail from SecureTheVote. I saw that I must put a stamp on it to get my ballot. Then I'd have to put another stamp to mail in that ballot. I feel this is a barrier especially for older people and with social distancing, to risk going out and getting stamps. I would be doing this for myself, my mom who will be 80 in June, and my sister – all over the age of 50.
4. We don't have any stamps in the house. Who uses stamps anymore? I don't really know how much they cost these days – maybe 35-45 cents. To get stamps, I'd have to go to the post office or grocery store. Some post offices are closed to walk ins now, so probably the grocery would be better. But this would definitely be cumbersome since grocery stores are high risk places for exposure.

5. I feel like basically, because of the fact that I have to go out of house, I'm taking the same risk as if having to go out to vote. Requiring postage is not minimizing my risk enough.
6. It would be much safer if stamps were not required, or would be provided. If we had the stamps, we would put our applications in our own mail box, and wouldn't have to leave home.
7. All 3 of us have voted, in person, in past elections. Even if I have to pay for postage, I would likely send in the application and ballot – it's that important to me. But voter suppression to me is real. My vote counts. Voting means a lot to me, so I will buy stamps if I have to. I'll also do it for sister and mom.
8. I give this Declaration freely, without coercion, and without any expectation of compensation or other reward.
9. I understand that in giving this Declaration, that I am not represented by a lawyer. Nor has any lawyer asked me to be their client or to serve in anyway as anything other than a witness in this litigation.
10. I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
