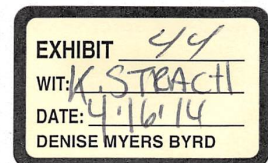

- For the 2010 General Election, there were 21,986 same day registration applications received during one-stop absentee voting.
- Only 21,742 of these ballots were accepted for counting.
- As of February 7th, 21,533 of these same day registrants are *Active* voters in the county of their same day registration.
- 153 (0.7%) of these same day registrants who registered and had their ballot counted are currently in *Inactive* status because the county was unable to verify the registrant's address by mail.
- 56 of the registrants who voted have subsequently been removed from the county of their same day registration.

- No registrant who was *Denied* cast a ballot that was counted in the 2010 General Election.
- The mail verification period takes 15 – 60 days. Most registrants are verified by mail within 15 days (at least 21,749).
