

Pursuant to 20 U.S.C. § 1746, I, Nancy J. Lund, hereby declare:

1. My name is Nancy J. Lund. I am a U.S. citizen and I am currently registered to vote in Rowan County, North Carolina.
2. I am a Plaintiff-Intervenor in the *League of Women Voters of North Carolina, et al. v. North Carolina, et al.*, Case No. 1:13-CV-660, currently pending in this Court.
3. As a voter in North Carolina, I have regularly availed myself of early voting. Voting early allows me to cast my ballot and then focus on helping others register and vote -- both activities that are very important to me and with which I have long been involved.
4. I previously lived in New York, where there was no early voting, and where I regularly experienced long waits at the polls on Election Day.
5. Prior to the repeal of pre-registration, my voter registration efforts included helping young people to pre-register, both at the Rowan County Fair and while doing door-to-door canvassing.
6. The repeal of pre-registration has complicated and substantially hindered these efforts; not only will I no longer be able to help young North Carolinians secure their future voting rights before they reach the age of majority, but efforts that I could have expended registering others will now have to be spent registering young voters who otherwise would have already registered through pre-registration as part of the mandatory voter registration drives at their high schools, which have also since been repealed by House Bill 589, Section 19.1 (repealing North Carolina General Statute 163-82.25).
